Ice Skating Ribbon: Rules

In the heart of The Hills at Charlesworth, with Edmonton's skyline as a backdrop, a ribbon of ice winds through the community's Sustainability Plaza, with solar lights cascading over it, surrounded by transplanted mature trees from the old Pioneer Meadows Golf Course. The ice ribbon is dramatically different from traditional community ice rinks, creating a multisensory experience integrated into the community's focal point: the Sustainability Plaza.

Complementing the ribbon are two repurposed sea can shelters where residents can enjoy a cup of hot chocolate and lace up their skates. In the summertime, the ribbon can be used as a walking or running ribbon.

The use of the ice ribbon, operated and managed by the Homeowners' Association between the months of October to April, is included in resident's' annual membership dues. The Homeowners' Association is responsible for providing seasonal rubberized matting on a portion of the plaza area for skaters. It is recommended that families put their skates on in the community sea can containers and use the rubberized matted pathway to access the ice ribbon.

Please note that operation of the ice ribbon is weather dependent, and, in the case of inclement weather, the Homeowners' Association has the right to close it at any time. This may include weather that is too cold, too much snow/precipitation, or too warm for the ice.

The Rules:

- Helmets are mandatory
- Skaters 8 years of age and under must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or supervising adult.
- Hockey sticks and shinny are permitted, but please be mindful of other community members using the ice surface.
- No pushing, shoving, fighting, or tripping while on the ice surface.
- No skaters shall carry other skaters while on the ice surface.
- Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the sea can shelter or on the ice surface as this is a public space.
- "Proof of community membership" skating tags must be on skates and visible.
- Use of The Hills at Charlesworth ice ribbon is "at your own risk", as there will be no attendant available.

It is highly recommended that all skaters:

- Wear a helmet at all times while on the ice surface. Serious head injury may be prevented by using an approved helmet.
- Leave valuables at home, rather than risk leaving them unattended at the ice ribbon.
